

KEY INFORMATION

TRAVEL AND TRANSPORT

All visitors should head to the Meadow on the Whiteknights campus on arrival to register and collect a wristband. There are several different ways you can travel to campus:



By Community Festival shuttle bus

A **free shuttle bus service** will be provided on selected routes across Reading – please see rdg.ac/communityfest for full details and the timetable.

You can also use the Leopard 3 bus route, free of charge to our Whiteknights Campus, just let the driver know that you are attending the Community Festival.

By public transport

Reading station is a mainline station and is easily accessible from most places in the UK.

By car

Please note the sat nav postcodes for festival parking are:

- Shinfield Road and Pepper Lane entrances: **RG6 6UR**
- Earley Gate entrance: **RG6 7BE**

Blue Badge holders should enter campus via the Shinfield Road entrance for access to the Nursery Car Park outside **Building No.196**.



TOILET FACILITIES

Toilet facilities are available in Reading Students' Union, Park House, SportsPark and the Health and Life Sciences building. Baby change facilities are available in Park House and Reading Students' Union.

FIRST AID

First aid, provided by ABC Medical, will be available in the gazebo next to the Information Point on the Meadow. If you require medical attention. Please notify a member of staff or find a student ambassador (wearing a red t-shirt) to assist you.

LOST PROPERTY

If you find any lost property, please advise a member of staff. If you have lost an item during your visit, please go to the information point on the Meadow where our staff will help you.

FILMING AND PHOTOGRAPHY

FIRE ALARMS

All buildings have fire detection equipment and fire alarms. If you hear a fire alarm, please evacuate the building by the nearest exit and move away from the area. University staff will take control of the emergency.

It is prohibited to smoke in any University building. All University buildings are smoke-free and no smoking is allowed in or within ten metres of any building on campus.
