For textbooks and similar learning resources, we recommend that you budget between £100 to £200 a year. Some books may be available second-hand, which will reduce costs. A range of resources to support the curriculum, including textbooks and electronic resources, are available through the library. Reading lists and module specific costs are listed on the individual module descriptions. The University provides funds for the enhanced DBS check required of all students at the beginning of the programme, and updated in year 3, but does not fund the update service. Printing and photocopying facilities are available on campus at a cost of £0.05 per page (price for 2022-2023). Students need to travel to external clinical placements that are offered across a large geographical area. While some placements will be local to the University, others will require travel by public transport or car which will involve additional cost depending on the distance and mode of travel. There will be some funding attached to this from Health Education England. Amounts and allowances will vary.
