



ACCOMMODATION for couples, families and mature students

Your guide to choosing accommodation at the University of Reading 2024–2025

WELCOME

The University has a range of accommodation which is suitable for mature students, couples and families. The accommodation consists of houses with converted rooms and self-contained flats as well as purpose-built studio rooms which are located within the halls.

WHY LIVE IN HALLS?

University accommodation provides a safe and secure environment for residents to live, study, meet friends and socialise as part of a supportive community.

LONGER LENGTH CONTRACTS

51-week contracts are available in most families, couples and mature students accommodation. Postgraduate students often select this option but it is also suitable for undergraduates who would like to use their room over the Summer vacation.

LOW DEPOSIT

A £250 deposit is all you need to pay to secure your room booking.

ALL INCLUSIVE RENT

Including all utility bills and Wi-Fi.

FURNISHED

Furnishings vary according to the size and type of accommodation but all accommodation includes a bed and mattress, desk, desk chair, shelves and wardrobe as a minimum.

CREIGHTON COURT

Suitable for families

Creighton Court is located ten minutes walk from central campus and includes 24 purpose-built self-contained flats suitable for families with one or two children under 12 years of age.

ACCOMMODATION GUARANTEE

Prospective students are guaranteed an offer of a single occupancy room if they are:

- a new full-time undergraduate who holds Reading as a Firm UCAS choice and applies for accommodation by 1 August and satisfies any conditions of their academic offer by 4 September 2024*.
- a new full-time postgraduate who has accepted an offer from the University and applies for accommodation by 1 August and satisfies any conditions of their academic offer by 4 September 2024*.
- * Subject to restrictions. Please see the Accommodation Policy.

Permitted occupants

There is a self-contained garden for the exclusive use of Creighton Court residents. There is a laundry on-site and a lockable bike shed. All flats offer showers over baths.

NORTHCOURT AVENUE HOUSES

Suitable for couples and mature students

There are three separate houses located on Northcourt Avenue which offer a range of options for mature students and couples. All of the accommodation on Northcourt Avenue has been recently refurbished which includes new carpets, kitchens and furniture.

Northcourt Avenue is a 10-minute walk from the Whiteknights campus centre and is less than a 5-minute walk from shops, cafes and a bus stop serving Reading town centre and the train station.

12 NORTHCOURT AVENUE

Large detached property spread over three floors with at least one bathroom per floor. Three kitchens, one on each floor, are shared by all of the residents. Rooms include a washbasin and bathroom facilities are shared with other residents.

14 NORTHCOURT AVENUE

This large detached house offers a range of rooms with their own individual style and character. The bathroom facilities are available on each floor and are shared between residents along with the kitchen. Some of the rooms include their own washbasin.

16 NORTHCOURT AVENUE

This large detached house offers a selection of self-contained flats and studios, as well as en-suite rooms with a shared kitchen. Ideally suited for mature single students and couples.

This traditional character property also benefits from a small enclosed garden.

ST PATRICK'S HALL FLATS/SETS

Suitable for couples and mature students

St Patrick's Hall is a 15-minute walk from the campus centre and conveniently located for local shops, eating places and buses to Reading town centre and station.

St George's, Wessex and Wantage Halls offer a selection of self-contained studios and flats. The pedestrian entrance to the rear of St George's Hall is located directly opposite the University SportsPark offering easy access to campus.

BENYON HALL FARMHOUSE

Suitable for couples and mature students

The Benyon Farmhouse is situated within the grounds of Benyon Hall. This 19th century historic listed building offers a range of accommodation suitable for couples and mature students. The property includes a shared garden to the rear. The Farmhouse is situated approximately 15 minutes' walk from the centre of campus and is close to local shops and bus stop into central Reading and the station.

SHERFIELD HALL FLATS

Suitable for couples and mature students

At the top of the Sherfield Hall accommodation blocks we have several one-bedroom flats suitable for couples and mature students. A short walk from the centre of campus and conveniently located for local shops and transport to Reading town centre and station.

GREENOW FLAT

Suitable for two students sharing

Located on the ground floor of Greenow House which is just a few minutes walk from Park Group social hub and the centre of campus.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT'S INCLUDED IN EACH ROOM/FLAT?

Families and Couples accommodation is all self-catered. All bedrooms are furnished with:

- bed, mattress and mattress protector
- desk and desk chair
- shelves and wardrobe.

All kitchens are equipped with:

- microwave
- fridge and kettle
- toaster
- cooker
- freezer.

In addition to your personal items, you will need to bring cookware (such as pots and pans).*

*A more detailed list of what you do and don't need to bring with you to your accommodation is included in your arrival information.

WHAT INFORMATION WILL I RECEIVE BEFORE I ARRIVE?

Before you arrive in hall you will be asked to complete a mandatory e-induction. This will include valuable arrival information, details of what to bring, a link to your *Halls A–Z Handbook* and an insight into hall life to prepare you for your time in hall.

CAN I GET AN ACCESSIBLE ROOM?

The University's Disability Team works closely with the Accommodation Office to assist students with specific requirements. They provide support and advice services. Contact **disability@reading.ac.uk** or **0118 378 8921** as soon as possible if you need an accessible room or have a particular requirement of your room due to a disability.

CAN I VIEW THE ACCOMMODATION PRIOR TO MOVING IN?

Once you receive an offer of accommodation you can request to view the room you've been offered. We will liaise with the current occupant and arrange the viewing where possible.

IS THERE ANY SINGLE SEX ACCOMMODATION AVAILABLE?

If you are seeking single sex accommodation the self-contained flats and studios listed on these webpages may be a good choice as the bathroom and kitchen facilities are not shared with other residents. Alternatively, there are single sex areas in some of the standard halls accommodation.

If you do require single sex accommodation please ensure you make this clear when submitting your accommodation application. Please liaise with our accommodation team if you wish to discuss further.



CAN I BRING MY CAR?

Except in very specific cases students living in halls are unable to bring a car and the area around the University is for local residents parking only. For all information regarding car, motorcycle or visitor parking please see www.reading.ac.uk/parking

All halls are within easy walking distance of Whiteknights campus and conveniently close to excellent bus routes serving supermarkets, Reading town centre and train station. Cycling is encouraged and lockable bike sheds/racks are available in all the halls.

CAN I LIVE IN HALL ACCOMMODATION BEYOND THE FIRST YEAR?

There is limited availability for returning students and there is no guarantee of being able to stay in the accommodation beyond the first year. Information about the returners application process is made available during the first term.
